Archery Elk Hunt

This list is just a recommendation of what you should bring if you are planning to come to Wyoming to archery elk hunt. If there is something else you think you should bring, by all means, go ahead and bring it. Wyoming has some tough weather and terrain, so we like to make sure you have an idea of what to expect while you are here.

- Hunting License & Conservation Stamp:
- Hunter Safety Card- If born after January 1st, 1966
- Bow minimum 50lbs and broadhead cannot pass through a $\frac{3}{4}$ state ring
 - You should be comfortable at shooting out to 50 yards
- Binoculars- 8x42 or 10x42
- Rangefinder
- Day Pack
 - Capable of carrying all of your gear
- Headwear- ball cap, stocking cap and neck gaiter
- Base Layer- Light to Medium weight
- Mid Layer- Fleece jacket or pullover, wool shirt, synthetic sweatshirt
- Outer Layer- Medium weight coat, water resistant preferred
- Rain Gear- Light packable rain jacket
- Pants- Bring two (2) Pairs. Make sure they are water resistant.
- Gaiters- Good quality and quiet- my preference is KUIU
- Socks- Light and medium weight hiking socks that are good quality. Wool or synthetic are best.
- Boots- Do not underestimate a good boot. Wyoming has some tough mountainous terrain, so a good pair of hiking boots with some thick tread is very important.
- Gloves- bring a heavy pair and a couple of light weight pairs.
- Headlamp- bring an extra set of batteries
- Sleeping bag- 15 degree or warmer bag
- Toiletries
 - Chapstick- we have dry air; your lips will get chapped
 - Tooth brush
 - Tooth paste
